The M.Ed. in Learning Design and Technology

The Master of Education in Learning Design and Technology (LDT) is housed in the Graduate School at Winthrop University. The program is fully online. It emphasizes the study and application of learning theory and technology skills that can be applied to learning problems in a wide range of settings. Students learn to apply skills through a hands-on, project-based learning curriculum. LDT students progress through the program as a cohort. Dr. Marshall Jones, *PhD* is the program director and teaches all classes in the curriculum.

Performance Analysis

The M.Ed. in Learning Design and Technology is open to students who hold bachelor's degrees in any field. It is expected that some students will have no prior knowledge of the fundamentals of education. As such it is necessary to provide a foundation in educational theory at the beginning of the curriculum. The LDT program has identified two areas where improvement is needed, instruction on *Dale's Cone of Experiences* and proficiency in the creation of infographics.

Dale's Cone of Experience

It is important for students to thoroughly understand Dale's Cone of Experience. This model is a critical tool in the toolbelt of an instructional designer. At present, the LDT program's educational materials for Dale's Cone of Experience include a chapter reading in the online textbook and an article reading. Students engage with the material through text readings, but the program seeks to expand into interactive multimedia learning to provide more robust instruction and increase the retention of knowledge.

Infographics

The creation of infographics is a common technological task for instructional designers. The LDT program provides basic instruction on the creation of infographics. However, graphic design is a skill that takes time to develop. Some students are not confident in their ability to create infographics. A carefully organized interactive module is needed to bring students up to speed quickly and efficiently.
